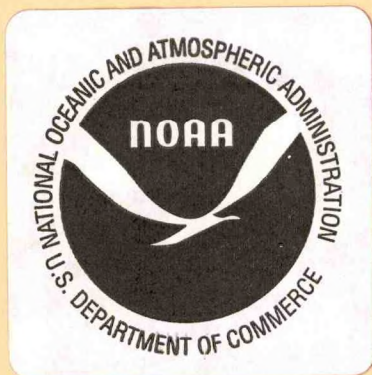
EDS National Oceanographic Data Center Subseries

The National Oceanographic Data Center (NODC) of NOAA's Environmental Data Service (EDS) is the central U.S. repository for unclassified oceanographic data and related marine science information pertaining to the world's oceans, seas, and estuaries. The Center receives data and published information from both domestic and foreign sources, including national data centers of other countries and World Data Center A, Oceanography--the United States subcenter for oceanography in the World Data Center system. NODC compiles the National Marine Data Inventory, which contains information on quantities and types of data, areas of operations, and responsible personnel. NODC services include data processing, reproduction of data, preparation of data summaries and inventories, evaluation of data records, special literature searches, and provision of general marine sciences information.

NOAA Technical Memoranda in the EDS NODC subseries facilitate rapid dissemination of information that may be preliminary in nature and subject to formal publication elsewhere at a later date. INTRODUCTION

Newsletters are a popular and effective means of disseminating information within an organization, to colleagues, to other organizations, and to the general public. The marine science community has taken advantage of this medium. This edition of "Marine Science Newsletters-1975: An Annotated Bibliography," the fifth to be published since 1965, includes references to 157 newsletters.

Newsletters are constantly changing. Many are discontinued because of whims of managers, budget cuts, the end of a program or project, or the abolishment of an agency or organization. New ones, however, appear with great regularity.

Some of the newsletters listed herein are not primarily marine science oriented; however, they include information about marine science activities with respect to area covered or subject matter.

In Part I, the newsletters are listed alphabetically. Each citation includes title, name, and address of publisher; frequency of publication; cost (if any); and annotations regarding content. Many of the publications are available free of charge to qualified users, as determined by the publisher.

Part II consists of an index to type of publisher, such as Sea Grant, academic, or business, and an alphabetical list of publishers, indexed to the appropriate newsletter.

While every attempt has been made to include all pertinent newsletters, some may have been overlooked. If so, please forward a sample for review and inclusion in a future revision of this publication.
