Aquatic Invaders in Your Classroom

The **AQUATIC INVADERS ATTACK PACK** is a rucksack filled with materials to help teach students and other groups about Great Lakes aquatic invasive species (AIS), the problems they cause and what can be done about them.

Each pack includes:

- preserved specimens of some of the most problematic AIS in the Great Lakes
- rugged plastic fact sheets
- classroom guide
- USB flash drive containing 10 lesson plans created by the Great Lakes Sea Grant Network

The packs are designed to complement the Nab the Aquatic Invaders! website hosted by Illinois-Indiana Sea Grant. The site offers hundreds of teaching tools, with multidisciplinary activities that integrate science, geography, math and language arts.

Wisconsin residents can borrow an Attack Pack for free from Wisconsin's Water Library by visiting **seagrant.wisc.edu/attackpack**. The pack will be delivered to your local library via the Library Delivery Network of Wisconsin.
