




- A new endowment has been established at the UGA Aquarium. It will be available for an undergraduate college student who will spend the summer working with aquarium curators and gaining new skills in animal husbandry.
- The UGA Marine Education Center and Aquarium's research vessel, the Sea Dawg, and the fleet of educational skiffs will be outfitted with new safety equipment and scientific tools that will improve student research on coastal waters.

OYSTER SOUTH SUPPORTS THE GROWTH OF OYSTER AQUACULTURE IN GEORGIA

Oyster South is a network of oyster farmers, restaurants, retailers and researchers who support successful oyster farming and healthy waters. They are committed to raising awareness about the oyster industry in the southeast, which has the potential to become the leader in oyster aquaculture, producing some of the best tasting oysters in the U.S.

This year, Oyster South hosted Landlocked, an event which featured handcrafted oysters from across the south, served on the half-shell by the shellfish growers that raised them. The event raised over \$20,000 for Marine Extension and Georgia Sea Grant's Shellfish Research Lab.

Oyster South also served as the presenting sponsor for this year's Oyster Roast for a Reason, joined by 24 other sponsor companies and organizations. The event was attended by over 300 people and raised roughly \$50,000 that will go towards expanding aquaculture research at the Shellfish Research Lab.
