


Delcambre, LA
















Proposal 1






View of Interior Plaza of the Waterfront Peninsula

- New Recreational Lagoon














Section through the Marketplace Delcambre Public Marina


Elevated structures that respond to the FEMA codes, provide the public with open air spaces that can be used as a temporary market.


