*This Step by Step primer was developed for Mississippi communities, but is designed to be easily adaptable to other states. Each state may have its own method of implementing the basic CRS guidance provided by FEMA, as is the case in Mississippi. See special section on page 9 about how Mississippi is currently implementing the CRS application process.

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OVERVIEW:

Navigating the application process for the Community Rating System can be somewhat daunting for communities, even though the benefits of participation can provide excellent incentives. This “Step by Step” primer offers some guidance that communities can use to perform a self-evaluation before beginning the formal application process.

STEP 1: PARTICIPATE IN THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

A community that regulates new development in floodplains can join the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), which offers the benefits of flood insurance backed by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) to cover public and private properties. Table 4 is a list of Mississippi communities that participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. Table 5 is a list of Mississippi communities that do not currently participate in the National Flood Insurance Program.

STEP 2: REVIEW THE BENEFITS OF CRS CLASSIFICATION

The Community Rating System (CRS) is a special program of the NFIP (National Flood Insurance Program) that provides additional benefits of reduced flood insurance premiums for floodplain management activities that exceed the NFIP’s minimum standards for floodplain regulation. Premium discounts for flood insurance policyholders in a CRS-rated community can be as much as 45%, as shown in Table 1.

Table 1: CRS Classifications & Discounts

This chart shows how much a premium is discounted for each CRS classification.

The amount of discount depends on what activities a community does.

Most Mississippi CRS communities have classifications ranging from 10 to 5.

SFHA (Zones A, AE, A1-A30, V, V1-V30, AO, & AH): Discount varies depending on class.

SFHA (Zones A99, AR, AR/A, AR/AE, AR/A1-A30, AR/AH, & AR/AO): 10% discount for Classes 1-6; 5% discount for Classes 7-9.

Non-SFHA (Zones B, C, X, D): 10% discount for Classes 1-6; 5% discount for Classes 7-9.

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STEP 3: REVIEW THE PREREQUISITES AND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR CRS

PREREQUISITES & MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR CRS CLASSIFICATION

These Prerequisites may be evaluated through the CAV Community Assistance Visit, explained in #2.

1. Active participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (Regular Phase) for at least one year (the “Regular Phase” means that a Flood Insurance Rate Map FIRM is in effect and full limits of coverage are available).

Per FEMA’s Minimum Requirements:

CRS Section 211 (Prerequisites) - The community must be in the Regular Phase of the NFIP and must be in full compliance with the minimum requirements of the NFIP.

An application to CRS must include a letter from the FEMA Regional Office confirming that the community is meeting all of the latest NFIP requirements and is in full compliance with the NFIP; the CRS application must be submitted no later than six months from the date of the acknowledgement letter from FEMA. The FEMA Regional Office for Mississippi is listed on page 6 in the Contact Information section.

2. Successful completion of a Community Assistance Visit (CAV) within the past twelve months. The CAV is performed by the FEMA Regional Office or the State NFIP Coordinator (MEMA) to determine the community’s full compliance with the minimum requirements of the NFIP (see above). This CAV visit is essentially an audit of the community’s current conditions and existing policies and regulations; if deficiencies are found, the CAV may require the correction of these deficiencies and the initiation of some additional floodplain management activities. The CRS application cannot be processed until this visit has been conducted, and FEMA has confirmed the community’s full compliance.
3. Documentation of repetitive loss properties in the community, in accordance with guidance and actions specified in Series 501-503 (additional details below in FEMA’s Minimum Requirements), CRS Application, FEMA Form #81-73, available at <http://training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/CRS/>.

Per FEMA’s Minimum Requirements:

CRS Sections 501–503 (Repetitive Loss Areas) - A community with properties that have received repeated flood insurance claim payments must map the affected areas. Communities with 10 or more such properties must prepare, adopt, and implement a plan to reduce damage in repetitive loss areas. The FEMA Regional Office can tell whether this applies to any given community. Activity 510 (Floodplain Management Planning) is **required** of designated repetitive loss communities.

4. Certification of coverage for all required flood insurance policies on public properties.

OTHER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

CRS Activity 310 (Elevation Certificates): This activity is **required** of all CRS communities. All CRS communities must maintain FEMA’s elevation certificates for all new and substantially improved construction in the floodplain after the date of application for CRS classification.

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STEP 4: TAKE THE QUICK CHECK SELF-TEST, A PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT OF A COMMUNITY'S POTENTIAL CRS CREDIT POINTS

Before completing a formal application and contacting FEMA/MEMA/ISO for assistance, communities can assess their potential CRS credit through completion of the Quick Check test. This test will give local officials a rough estimate of the community's potential CRS points upon application to the CRS program. A minimum of 500 points is needed to receive a CRS Class 9 classification for a 5% reduction in premium rates. If a community does not qualify for at least 500 points, the quick check can identify new activities that can be implemented fairly quickly and inexpensively; for example, some of the public information activities (Series 300).

QUICK CHECK TEST: For each of the activities listed below that ***your community is already doing***, enter the number in parentheses (which is the average community score from Table 2) in the blank at the left of the activity. The Quick Check test uses only the activities most frequently used in CRS applications.

Public Information Activities (Series 300)

- _____ 69 (69) **310 (Elevation Certificates)** Maintain FEMA elevation certificates for all new construction. Since this activity is ***required for all CRS communities*** following CRS application, the credit points have already been inserted for you.
- _____ (138) **320 (Map Information Service)** Respond to inquiries to identify a property's FIRM zone and publicize this service.
- _____ (90) **330 (Outreach Projects)** Send information about the flood hazard, flood insurance, and flood protection measures to flood-prone residents or all residents of the community.
- _____ (19) **340 (Hazard Disclosure)** Real estate agents advise potential purchasers of flood-prone property about the flood hazard; or regulations require a notice of the flood hazard.
- _____ (24) **350 (Flood Protection Information)** The public library and/or community's website maintains references on flood insurance and flood protection.
- _____ (53) **360 (Flood Protection Assistance)** Give inquiring property owners technical advice on protecting their buildings from flooding, and publicize this service.

SUBTOTAL: SERIES 300. PUBLIC INFORMATION ACTIVITIES

Mapping and Regulatory Activities (Series 400)

- _____ (86) **410 (Additional Flood Data)** Develop new flood elevations, floodway delineations, wave heights, or other regulatory flood hazard data for an area that was not mapped in detail by the flood insurance study; or have the flood insurance study's hydrology or allowable floodway surcharge based on a higher state or local standard.
- _____ (191) **420 (Open Space Preservation)** Guarantee that a portion of currently vacant floodplain will be kept free from development.
- _____ (166) **430 (Higher Regulatory Standards)** Require freeboard; require soil tests or engineered foundations; require compensatory storage; zone floodplain for minimum lot sizes of 1 acre or larger; require coastal construction standards in AE zones; regulate to protect sand dunes; or have regulations tailored to protect critical facilities or areas subject to special flood hazards (e.g., alluvial fans, ice jams, subsidence, or coastal erosion).
- _____ (79) **440 (Flood Data Maintenance)** Keep flood and property data on computer records; use better base maps; or maintain elevation reference marks.
- _____ (98) **450 (Stormwater Management)** Regulate new development throughout the watershed to ensure that post-development runoff is no worse than predevelopment runoff.

SUBTOTAL: SERIES 400. MAPPING AND REGULATORY ACTIVITIES

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Flood Damage Reduction Activities (Series 500)

- _____ (115) **510 (Floodplain Management Planning):** Prepare, adopt, implement, and update a comprehensive plan using a standard planning process.
- _____ (213) **520 (Acquisition and Relocation):** Acquire and/or relocate flood-prone buildings so that they are out of the floodplain.
- _____ (93) **530 (Flood Protection):** Document flood-proofed or elevated pre-FIRM buildings.
- _____ (232) **540 (Drainage System Maintenance):** Conduct periodic inspections of all channels and retention basins and perform maintenance as needed.

_____ **SUBTOTAL: SERIES 500, FLOOD DAMAGE REDUCTION ACTIVITIES**

Flood Preparedness Activities (Series 600)

- _____ (93) **610 (Flood Warning Program):** Provide early flood warnings to the public and have a detailed flood response plan keyed to flood crest predictions.
- _____ (198) **620 (Levee Safety):** Maintain levees that are not credited with providing base flood protection.
- _____ (66) **630 (Dam Safety):** All communities in a state with an approved dam safety program receive this credit.

_____ **SUBTOTAL: SERIES 600, FLOOD PREPAREDNESS ACTIVITIES**

_____ **TOTAL FOR ALL SUBTOTALS ABOVE, SERIES 300-600 = TOTAL ESTIMATED CRS POINTS FOR THE COMMUNITY**

If TOTAL (above) is at least 500 points, your community should begin the process of applying for CRS classification. You are ready to move to **Step 5**.

STEP 5: CONTACT YOUR STATE NFIP COORDINATOR

A visit to your community will be scheduled by the State NFIP Coordinator (Mississippi Emergency Management Agency) and/or the ISO/CRS Specialist to verify your CRS eligibility. An interview will be conducted with the floodplain manager. The ISO/CRS Specialist can help calculate your actual CRS credit score and answer questions about the CRS Program. He will also help with the formal application, designate a CRS Coordinator, and guide you through other steps during the application process.

NOTE 1: If your community has not successfully completed a CAV within the past twelve months (described in Step 3, Prerequisites), the verification visit may result in a CAV to assess the community's compliance with the minimum requirements of the NFIP.

NOTE 2: Regardless of the date of your application, CRS classifications are made only twice a year. New classifications take effect on May 1 or October 1, whichever date follows completion of the CRS application process.

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MISSISSIPPI'S CURRENT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM PROGRAM

Mississippi has adopted a proactive approach to implementing the CRS Community Rating System Program. MEMA (Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, the State NFIP Coordinator) is conducting Community Assistance Visits (CAVs) on all Mississippi communities that participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. Table 4 provides a listing of these Mississippi NFIP communities. While in the community conducting the CAV, MEMA representatives talk to community leaders about the CRS Program and may follow up this conversation with a letter to the community inviting them to join the Program. This letter provides details, including an estimate of how much the flood insurance premium savings could be if the community joined the CRS. If the community decides to join, the community's chief executive official must send a letter requesting to participate in the Program (refer to Step 3, Prerequisite #1, FEMA's Minimum Requirements). MEMA will provide a form letter for the community to use for this purpose. Once MEMA/FEMA receives the official request letter from the community, the ISO/CRS Specialist will contact the community to schedule the verification visit. The CAV must be completed and all issues resolved before a community is cleared to complete the CRS Application.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE CRS COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM PROGRAM

All 18 creditable CRS activities are described in the CRS Application, Series 300-600; this numbering system is used for all CRS publications. Most CRS activities are optional, except for those listed under Minimum Requirements or Prerequisites.

There are ways to earn extra credit points beyond those listed in the Series 300-600 table. For example, communities that coordinate CRS activities through a comprehensive floodplain management plan can earn extra credit, and extra credit is given for mapping and regulation activities if your community is experiencing growth pressures. A new CRS recommendation suggests that local governments adopt regulations that require building foundations in the Coastal A Zone to comply with the more stringent design requirements applied to V Zones. For communities who adopt the Coastal A Zone policy, as it is referred to within CRS, a CRS community can earn 250 points. Additional credit points are also available under this new guideline. For more information, go to the CRS website and review the document entitled "CRS Credit for Areas with Limited Moderate Wave Action (LiMWA) and Coastal AE Zones".

Some credits are automatically provided in certain states. Communities may qualify for "uniform minimum credits", based on activities that a state or regional agency implements on behalf of all communities in the region. You may be able to receive CRS credit for other activities that your community implements to increase public safety, reduce property damage, avoid economic disruption and loss, and protect the environment, even if these activities are not specifically listed as CRS-eligible. This is done through a request for review by FEMA of these activities.

After acceptance in the CRS Program, communities must recertify annually by submitting progress reports. Every few years, a CRS community will undergo a "cycle visit", another verification visit.

If a CRS community is determined at any time to not be in full compliance with the minimum requirements of the NFIP, the community's status will revert to a CRS Class 10, which does not provide any premium discounts. Once these compliance issues have been successfully resolved, the community can be reinstated to the CRS Program.
