#### Tarpon (Megalops atlanticus) Genetic Recapture Study

#### MOTE MARINE LABORATORY FINAL REPORT APRIL 1, 2011 – MARCH 15, 2012

During the contract period of April 1, 2011 through March 15, 2012, Mote Marine Laboratory (MML) Directorate of Fisheries and Aquaculture worked in partnership with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute (FWRI) to conduct and coordinate the Tarpon (*Megalops atlanticus*) Genetic Recapture Study (TGRS) around the state of Florida. The goal of the TGRS is to engage anglers in providing DNA samples and corresponding tarpon capture data to use in the evaluation of migration and movement of individual fish recapture rates, connectivity of tarpon between bodies of Florida waters, fish survival, and with time, we may be able to determine if juvenile tarpon caught in Florida provide adult tarpon to Florida's recreational fishery. Involving recreational and professional tarpon angler "citizen scientists" as well as businesses (e.g. bait and tackle shops) around the state are key to the success of this study.

#### Background

The TGRS was established by FWRI as a fin clip program in 2005. In 2007, FWRI and MML efforts were primarily focused on establishing a network of anglers from around the state to take DNA samples and provide their associated tarpon capture information. At this same time, FWRI and MML shifted methodology to encouraging anglers to sample tarpon by taking a skin scrape on the outer portion of the jaw rather than taking a dorsal fin clip. In 2009, FWRI and MML promoted the program state-wide with particular attention directed to the Florida Keys and Florida's east coast to increase samples for DNA analysis. The FWRI partnership with MML staff and volunteers has been an asset in strengthening the program.

#### Accomplishments

Mote Marine Laboratory staff and volunteers worked in partnership with FWRI to promote, develop, and expand the TGRS around the entire coastal area of the state of Florida. The partnership continued to substantially increase angler participation in the tarpon sampling program and establish anglers as stakeholders by having them contribute DNA samples and corresponding fish capture data. This included actively informing anglers of the importance of this project and involving them as stakeholders to collect DNA samples and record capture information from "All Tarpon-Anywhere, Any Size". This partnership has resulted in valuable biological and fishery data being collected for assessing tarpon stocks. Activities performed by MML from April 1, 2011 through March 15, 2012 are included.

#### Participants

The MML portion of the TGRS was directed by Carole Neidig, M.S. (Staff Scientist) and Thomas King, Ph.D. (Senior Biologist). Assistance was provided by MML staff from other departments and MML Directorate of Fisheries and Aquaculture volunteers. Assistance provided by MML staff other than C. Neidig and T. King included:

- Sue Ryan, Office Administrator and Anna Marie Perez, Receptionist distributed educational handouts and sampling kits to interested anglers at the MML reception desk,
- Dan Bebak, Aquarium Director and his staff and volunteers directed interested visiting anglers to the MML reception desk or to C. Neidig or T. King to obtain a sampling kit,
- Aaron Adams, MML Staff Scientist and Director of Operations for the Bonefish & Tarpon Trust assisted by distributing study information and sampling kits, and
- Glenn Markos, Mote Aquarium Mobile Exhibit (MAME) director and MAME volunteers (including Ray Walborn, TGRS volunteer) who presented the study and distributed DNA sampling kits at community events along the west coast of Florida,

In addition to MML staff, thirteen primary MML volunteers (seasonal and resident) provided invaluable assistance with the study. Volunteers assisted by preparing materials for sampling kits, assembling sampling kits, contacting angler related businesses through phone calls and emails, preparing mailings to businesses and anglers, performing internet searches (potential poster sites, angler products, study articles on web sites), printing, laminating, obtaining products from local and national businesses for angler prizes, visiting businesses, assisting at tournaments, and promoting the study at events. The primary MML Tarpon Team volunteers included: John Arbuckle, Fran Bays, Viola Filoso, Faith Graves, Dick Helvig, Bobby Hilbrunner, Stanley Kodach, Joe Mazza, Cindy McClure, Roger Mitchell, Bob Steskal, Ray Walborn, and Janice Wojick., In addition, interns Alicia Vollimer (Florida State University) and Chadwick Vollimer (Sarasota High School) assisted from June through August 2011.

Staff from FWRI and MML forged partnerships with staff from additional agencies, businesses, and angler organizations around the state of Florida as well as several southeastern states and other countries to increase angler participation, gain assistance in sampling kit distribution, and to inform the angler community of study progress. Study collaborations continued with Florida Sea Grant Extension Offices, St. Petersburg National Marine Fisheries Service, Everglades National Park, numerous tarpon tournament series on the west coast and in the Keys, and the South Carolina Coastal Conservation Association. In 2011, the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries joined the TGRS and have made the study part of their state's research plan.

#### Increase Awareness

An important component of the TGRS was for MML to assist FWRI in promoting the study to anglers and the angler community. Anglers were encouraged to become "citizen scientists" by providing tarpon DNA samples and related fish capture data. Another important component was keeping the angler community informed of results and emphasizing the value of their participation. Participating anglers that received feedback and understood that they were invaluable contributors to the study often helped to spread the word. The following were methods used by FWRI and MML to promote the study:

- involved the participation of bait and tackle shops,
- personal phone contact with shops and many angler participants,
- personal visits to many of the shops,
- promoted media involvement through press releases and interviews,
- provided study updates and encouraged angler involvement through participation on radio shows,
- presented and promoted the study at club meetings, captain meetings, tournament award ceremonies, and angler community events,
- personally contacted guides to encourage participation,
- encouraged tournament participants to collect samples,
- collected samples from anglers at tournaments,
- provided posters for display at businesses, boat ramps, and marinas,
- provided handouts and newsletters to anglers,
- encouraged guides, artists, and businesses to issue angler challenges,
- involved local and national businesses in donating reward items, and
- provided angler prize awards to promote the study at events.

#### **DNA Sampling Kit Distribution and Sample Collection Locations**

The 206 participating bait and tackle shops (Appendix) were instrumental in promoting the TGRS to local anglers, providing sampling kits, and accepting samples from anglers. To help increase the coverage of bait and tackle shops around the state, T. King contacted additional shops and enlisted their participation. In addition, K. Guindon and C. Gardinal (FWRI) enlisted new shops and provided contact information to T. King. During the contract period several shops closed, changed ownership and/or changed names, and new shops were recruited. As shops were added or deleted, T. King updated the participating shop list on the internal FWRI Share Point site by uploading an Excel® spreadsheet. In addition, he notified David Westmark (FWRI) and Chris Gardinal (FWRI) of the changes made to the list so that they could use the file to update the FWC, FWRI TGRS Website page. The site was updated by D. Westmark in February 2012. T. King also used the spreadsheet to print participating shop lists for angler events. Electronic copies of the list were provided to Vangie Collins and Kay Frantz (FWC Administrative Assistants) at the Stock Enhancement Research Facility (SERF) to use as reference for anglers who call the FWC Fish Tag Hotline. In addition, an electronic copy was provided to G. Russo (FWC, SERF) for use during outreach activities.

The TGRS team strived to increase shop participation around the state, particularly in the Panhandle, east coast, southeast, and in the Florida Keys. The following were the number of participating shops (206) per region as of March 10, 2012:

- Northwest (36),
- West Central (49),
- Southwest (28),
- Everglades (3),
- Florida Keys (34),
- Southeast (33),
- East Central (15), and
- Northeast (8).

During the tarpon angling season in each region, shops were called at least once per month, with active shops called more frequently (e.g. weekly) by T. King to confirm if samples needed to be retrieved or if sampling kits or handouts were needed. He also encouraged shop staff to call the FWRI toll free number or his mobile number if they were in the need of sampling kits or had samples to return. Some shops requested that it was not necessary for us to call them, but they would call when they needed supplies or had samples.

To expedite sample returns before the TGRS October 31, 2011 deadline, each shop was called to request if they had samples from anglers or if they could encourage anglers to submit their samples. In addition, he thanked the shop staff for their participation and support and encouraged their continued involvement.

As per K. Guindon's request in January 2012, T. King called all of the TGRS participating shops in the northwest region to inform them of two tarpon outreach events in February. A Science -Café event in Carrabelle on February 28, 2012, featured K. Guindon and J. Ault (University of Miami) presenting "Understanding Tarpon and How You Can Help the Scientists". In addition, T. King explained that there would be a Tarpon Workshop held the following day at the Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve. He requested that the shop staff help to spread the word about the events to their angler clients and that he would send them a printed copy of the information in the mail to display in their shop. Each shop was mailed a copy of the presentation and workshop announcement.

T. King noted that when shops were called in a region during a time of busy tarpon activity, it was usually necessary to start calling the shops over again as soon as the last shop was contacted. Some shops were efficient in calling T. King or the FWC Fish Tag Hotline to request additional kits. Often it was necessary to make repeated calls if shops were closed because of bad weather or if shop assistants requested that we call when the manager or owner was available. Numerous shops experienced frequent staff turn-over or had several part-time staff, making it necessary to try to keep staff informed about the study

so that they would be knowledgeable when interested anglers visited their business.

Many shop managers called the FWC Fish Tag Hotline or T. King directly to request a pre-paid mailer to send samples directly to MML, though shops were encouraged to mail samples directly to FWRI. Samples returned to MML from a shop were logged into the Shop Notebook prior to being provided to FWRI.

T. King kept a record of individual shops by region and kept track of each phone call, visit by FWRI or MML staff or volunteers, or other correspondence with shops. During a phone call to a shop, the following information was recorded on a form (Appendix):

- the name of the person contacted,
- date,
- requests made by shop employee (e.g. need poster, handouts, sampling kits, sample mailer),
- number of tarpon samples at the shop,
- information on whether the shop would mail the samples or if MML would need to retrieve samples,
- comments made by shop staff concerning tarpon fishing in that area, tournaments, club meetings, and any other pertinent information,
- number of kits or handouts sent, and
- the date materials were sent.

To help prevent the loss of samples in bait shops, plastic boxes ( $12^{\circ} \times 5^{\circ} \times 3.5^{\circ}$ ) or ( $6^{\circ} \times 6^{\circ} \times 3.5^{\circ}$ ) were purchased by MML and one was distributed to each shop. Some shops requested a new box. Each box displayed a TGRS sticker on the lid and an FWC Fish Tag Hotline telephone number sticker provided by G. Russo (SERF) on one side.

T. King noted that from conversations with participating shop staff that they were enthusiastic about promoting the study. Some shops indicated that they were eager to help; however, some indicated it was difficult to get anglers to take kits because there was not much tarpon activity in their area. Some shop owners or managers called to tell us that they had heard of the study and wanted to be included as a kit distribution and sample collection location.

From November 2011 through January 2012, shop activity slowed in all areas, though several shops requested sampling supplies. Several shops were removed from the list because of lack of participation, with few tarpon anglers visiting their business. Several shops stated they may not be open in 2012 because of the economy, and some closed during late in the year and planned to reopen in March or June 2012. As a result of continued contact with the shops and the updates of study results provided to them, anglers and shop owners have been eager to participate. Frequent calls made by T. King helped to forge a primary contact point for shop staff. Many of the shop staff stated that calling and/or visiting and taking time to speak to managers and staff about the study

and asking about how fishing was in their area helped to encourage their participation as stakeholders in the study.

During the contract period there were 1,452 tarpon DNA samples submitted to MML. The samples were primarily from shops, and many of the samples sent to MML were in self-addressed stamped envelopes provided by MML. Some shop staff indicated that their anglers mailed their samples directly to FWRI, as was encouraged by MML. There were also individual anglers that requested pre-paid mailers from MML for their samples. All samples submitted to MML were recorded and tracked to keep record of numbers from each shop and from individual anglers. Samples were provided to FWRI in a timely manner for processing.

In addition to the shops, T. King kept in contact with representatives of several organizations who distributed kits for the study. These organizations included: Rookery Bay Reserve, Everglades National Park, the South Carolina Coastal Conservation Association and newly added Southeastern Wildlife Conservation Group.

In January 2012, a Certificate of Appreciation (Appendix) and a thank you letter from the TGRS Team were mailed by MML to each shop. Artist Jeanne Johnson from Sugarloaf Marina provided MML with permission to feature her Gyotaku tarpon on the certificate.

#### Posters

No changes were made to the TGRS laminated posters during the contract period. Two sized posters were distributed, an 11 inch x 17 inch and an 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch x 11 inch (Appendix). Both posters advertised the jaw scrape sampling method using maroon scrub pads.

During the report period, MML continued to identify locations around the state where the TGRS posters could be displayed and be viewed by potential tarpon anglers. These locations did not include the bait and tackle shops. Focus was placed on identifying public and private marinas and boat ramps in coastal areas and obtaining permission to display the TGRS poster in kiosks, outside marinas, and alongside boat ramps frequented by anglers. This involved internet searches, perusing boating booklets and magazines, contacting county visitor centers, park offices, guides, fishing club members, and recreational boating resources. Volunteers, R. Walborn and B. Hilbrunner were responsible for contacting the appropriate personnel and provided letters of request and electronic copies of the poster for review. In February 2012, B. Hilbrunner contacted the locations to confirm that they still had their poster or were in need of a replacement. B. Hilbrunner and T. King followed up with contacts as necessary and sent posters and handouts to the facilities for posting. Some of the locations requested that they be called after March to see if they needed a replacement at that time. As of March 10, 2012, there were 161 businesses or parks displaying 201 posters state-wide (Appendix). Some parks had multiple locations (e.g. boat ramp and in a park office) where posters were displayed.

#### Handouts

Several handouts supplemental to the TGRS (see below) were available to anglers requesting tarpon DNA sampling kits at events and by mail from FWRI or MML staff:

- FWC "Regulation" publication,
- Fishing Lines Magazine,
- Estimate the weight of your tarpon cards
- Tarpon Quick Fact Sheet,
- Participating Shop list (listing of shops in the anglers area), and
- Current Study Newsletter.

Anglers were also informed that several of these items could be accessed on the FWRI website.

Electronic copies of the Tarpon Quick Facts (Appendix) and the most recent newsletter were provided to V. Collins, K. Frantz, and G. Russo (SERF), G. Markos (MML Mobile Exhibit), M. Bailey (NMFS), B. Fleuch (Sea Grant), Elizabeth Staugler (Sea Grant), and Todd Stamps (South Carolina CCA) for distribution.

In addition, a business card advertising the TGRS was provided to anglers at events so that the interested angler could contact the FWC Fish Tag Hotline to request a sampling kit. Cards were printed at MML and distributed to the TGRS team to have on hand at events.

#### **Outreach Events**

There were 28 tournaments in 2011 in which FWRI and/ or MML staff attended or provided event coordinators with TGRS sampling supplies and educational materials. Seventeen community outreach events were also attended or provided with materials. A list of the events is presented in the TGRS 2011 Genetic Recapture Review Newsletter (Appendix), omitted were the Hunting and Fishing Exposition, Indian Rocks, FL, Sci-Café Presentation, Carrabelle, FL, and Tarpon Workshop, Eastpoint, FL that took place in February 2012. In addition, the MML Mobile Exhibit exhibited TGRS materials at least eleven community events from St. Petersburg to Fort Myers.

Since January 2012, MML and FWRI staff and MML volunteers worked on updating a list of tournaments and events for 2012. These were gathered from input from FWRI staff, correspondence with anglers, information provided by tournament and angler event representatives internet searches, and from magazine and newspaper listings. Staff contacted event organizers to request TGRS participation to promote the study and, if a tournament, encourage the collection of DNA samples. Some event postings were listed, but organizers had not set dates as of February 2012. Events were listed on the FWRI Share Point site as information became available.

#### **Additional Outreach**

A valuable part of study promotion was the Genetic Recapture Review Newsletter (Appendix) developed by K. Guindon (FWRI) and the FWRI and MML TGRS Team with Graphic Design by Jessica Pernell. The 2011 newsletter was mailed by FWRI to anglers and participating shops in January 2012 to promote the study and provide results from 2011 to the stakeholders. Another valuable promotion was the FWRI website (myfwc.com/research/saltwater/tarpon/) which included study information, press releases, archived newsletters, interesting articles, and a downloadable participating bait and tackle shop list.

In 2011, Florida Sea Grant and the Information and Communications Services at the University of Florida worked closely with K. Guindon and fishing guides from Tampa Bay and the Ten Thousand Islands to create a Sea Grant funded video on the TGRS for FWRI and MML to use for promotion. The video was released in March 2012, and will be beneficial to display at events. It is available on the Florida Sea Grant Website and on You Tube at the following link, http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qzDwh5HcpJA.

In February 2012, Janice Wojick of Wojick and Short & Associates agreed to work with MML and FWRI in preparing a brochure to promote the TGRS. The cost of the graphic set-up and printing will be at no expense to FWRI or MML. She also provided additional TGRS postcards and Thank You note cards for use in the study. These items were donated through MML.

In 2011, MML was fortunate to receive a grant from the Islamorada Fishing and Conservation Trust (IFACT) to help to enhance the TGRS in Monroe County. As reported by FWRI in the TGRS Newsletter (Appendix), the number of DNA samples returned from the Florida Keys went up 64% from the previous year. The support from IFACT was instrumental in helping us to promote the TGRS in Monroe County.

#### **Reward Program and Angler Challenge Promotions**

B. Steskal and F. Bays (TGRS Donation Coordinator volunteers), and C. Neidig acquired items from local and national businesses for 2011-2012 angler rewards, bi-monthly angler awards, and for study promotions (i.e. gift baskets awarded at tournaments for the most samples submitted). These contacts were made through numerous phone calls to businesses, visiting business representatives at angler shows (i.e. Tampa Tribune Exposition and Florida Sportsman Shows), and visiting local businesses and others while traveling. In addition, some of the participating bait and tackle shops were approached for gift certificates or in-kind items. All in-kind and or cash donations (for t-shirts) were recorded and provided to the MML Donation Office. Each sponsor was sent an acknowledgement for their donation. In addition, a Certificate of Appreciation (Appendix) similar to the one sent to participating bait and tackle shops was also sent to each sponsor in January 2012 for items provided in 2011.

During the contract period in 2011, MML acquired prizes for six TGRS Bi-Monthly Awards. The award period and winner(s) were as follows: January - February *Tarpon (Megalops atlanticus) Genetic Recapture Study, FWC Contract No. 10322, Final Report April 1, 2011-March 15, 2012. Mote Technical Report No. 1601.* 

2011 (Frederick Lieb, Bokeelia), March – April 2011 (Craig Korczynski, Royal Palm Beach), May – June (Brian Jill, Palm Harbor), July – August (Cameron Gorski, Sarasota and Lance Schouest, Houma, LA), September - October (Randy Dalzell, Sr., Palm Bay), and November - December (Robert Gorta, Largo, FL). The anglers received gift certificates of \$250.00 provided by SeaSucker, Sarasota, FL, knives provided by Cutco Knives, and one angler received a hand-made tarpon platter by Kathy Zimmerman of SnookZGraphics, St. Petersburg, FL. Prize packages also included a TGRS hat (provided by FWRI), t-shirt, decal, and other donated angler items.

In 2011, T. King and C. Neidig provided a proposal to Power Pole, requesting funding to sponsor Angler Reward t-shirts. Upon receiving the award from Power-Pole, T. King worked with Black Tip GraFX in Palmetto, FL and artist Jeanne Johnson, Sugarloaf Marina, Sugarloaf, FL on a reward t-shirt design. Ms. Johnson provided permission to use her Gyotaku print of a school of three tarpon. The angler award shirts were long sleeve featuring the TGRS logo and the FWC and MML logos on the front, the three Gyotaku Tarpon school print on the back and the primary shirt sponsor "Power Pole" on the back below the print.

In October 2011, the shirts were mailed to participating anglers from 2010 who submitted five or more tarpon DNA samples. T. King had previously contacted each angler to obtain their shirt size, a somewhat difficult task to say the least, with anglers having moved, changed addresses, phone numbers or email addresses (or with none of the above listed). The Share-Point angler information site was updated based on information obtained from the direct angler contacts. A total of 128 long-sleeved shirts were sent to anglers and 60 short-sleeved shirts were provided to MML volunteers, FWRI personnel who help with the study directly, or were kept for placing in tournament gift baskets and as additional rewards.

A TGRS decal with a black logo on green background was also sent to anglers who returned one or more tarpon DNA samples as a thank you gift and study promotion. The decals were purchased by MML through funds donated by J.L Marine Systems/Power Pole.

In 2012, T. King and C. Neidig submitted a proposal to J.L. Marine Systems, Inc. /Power Pole to request funding support to sponsor Angler Reward t-shirts and decals for 2011 anglers. There were 121 anglers eligible for a t-shirt, submitting more than five DNA samples. T. King received permission from artist/Captain Brian Esposito for permission to use his pencil sketch of a tarpon head as the artwork for the 2011 angler t-shirts. He also requested bids from three t-shirt companies for shirts and TGRS decals. T. King called and or emailed each angler from 2011 that submitted five or more samples to obtain their shirt size and thank them for their participation. It was explained that shirts would be awarded depending on donation funds being granted. The angler shirt sizes as well as any corrections in their address and other contact information were entered into the angler database in Share Point. Anglers were excited and appreciative and expressed gratitude for the possibility of receiving the shirt.

Several anglers had received shirts from submitting more than five samples in 2010 or 2009.

In December 2011, FWRI staff determined the "Top Ten" anglers who submitted the most samples from January through October 31, 2011, and randomly chose 10 anglers from those who submitted samples to receive angler incentives. These 20 anglers were sent prize packages prepared by MML that contained numerous items (e.g. art work, cutting boards, clothing, gift certificates, flies, lures, sunscreen, tackle bags, boat cleaning products, rod holders, sunglasses, books) donated by national and local businesses.

Sponsors during 2011 who provided items for gift baskets, bi-monthly angler prizes, challenge gifts, and support for t-shirts included: Bass Pro Shop of Fort Myers, Black Tip GraFX, Bob's Machine Shop, Breathe Like A Fish, Cabala's, Clyde Butcher Venice Gallery & Studio, Coastal Angler Magazine, Cutco Cutlery, Corp., Dave Markett, Dawson Agency, Discount Tackle, D.O.A. Fishing Lures, Economy Tackle/Dolphin Dive, El Capitan Sports Center, Inc., Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Fran Bays, Jeannie Johnson/Quadruple Gallery, J.L. Marine Systems, Inc./Power Pole, John B's Fly & Light Tackle, Kathy Zimmerman/Snook ZGraphics, Mote Marine Laboratory, Mr. Bones, New Pass Grill & Bait Shop, SeaSucker, Shepard's Red Barn, Tropical Seas, West Marine, Wojick & Short Associates, and Woody Wax.

#### Media

During the contract period, FWRI and Mote strived to promote the TGRS through the media. At least 56 media articles concerning the study were published in magazines, newspapers, and on internet websites in 2011 (Appendix). Mote and FWRI staff and MML volunteers collected articles about the TGRS through internet searches, directly from the publishing source, or from anglers who provided the article. Copies of the articles were placed in two notebooks for MML and FWRI staff and volunteers to display at events. F. Bays and S. Kodach (MML volunteers) entered the articles into an Excel® database including the article date, title, author, and media source. Articles for 2011 and 2012 (January-March) will be uploaded to the Share Point site in March 2012.

J. Wolf, owner and editor of the Florida Keys Coastal Angler Magazine agreed to continue featuring a monthly article in 2012 concerning the TGRS. In 2012, K. Guindon submitted an article for the March 2012 Keys edition. She also submitted one to the Fish Monster Magazine in Key West. An article was also included in the March edition of *Sport Fishing Magazine*. In March, K. Guindon promoted the TGRS in northwest Florida and an article (<u>http://nwfdailynews.com/articles/tarpon-47901-research-day.html</u>) was submitted to seven newspapers in the area.

An additional new media resource included "You Tube", in which K. Guindon was featured on Panhandle Outdoors (<u>http://youtu.be/8ybbPovbyOw</u>) in March 2012. An additional resource included television shows, including the Chevy Florida Insider Fishing Report with Captain Rick Murphy and several in the Panhandle *Tarpon (Megalops atlanticus) Genetic Recapture Study, FWC Contract No. 10322, Final Report April 1, 2011-March 15, 2012. Mote Technical Report No. 1601.* 

that included interviews with K. Guindon in March 2012. Several anglers have stated that they saw the TGRS mentioned on a television show or on the radio.

In January 2012, R. Walborn (MML volunteer) commenced updating a database of radio stations, angler oriented magazines and newspapers resources, and angler clubs. These will be contacted to assist with study promotion.

#### **DNA Sampling Kits**

During the contract period, no changes were made to the TGRS sampling kits, which consisted of the following:

- (3) data form slips printed on waterproof paper for the angler to record fish capture date, time, county, location, approximate total length, time it took to capture the fish, and angler contact information,
- (1) number 2 pencil,
- (3) 20mL plastic vials containing 20% ETOH storage solution,
- (3) rectangular pieces of 3M<sup>©</sup> maroon abrasive scrub pads, and
- folded instruction sheet describing study background, objectives, and methods for taking a DNA sample (printed on 28 lb. glossy paper).

In addition to providing sampling kits with three vials, kits with 12 vials "Captain Bag" were also made in one gallon size plastic Ziploc® bags. These kits included:

- (12) data form slips printed on waterproof paper for the angler to record fish capture date, time, location, approximate total length, time it took to capture the fish, and angler contact information,
- (1) number 2 pencil,
- (12) 20mL plastic vials containing 20% ETOH storage solution, and
- (12) rectangular pieces of 3M<sup>©</sup> maroon abrasive scrub pads.

An instruction sheet was not included in these kits since they were distributed to anglers who already participated.

The MML volunteers assembled tarpon DNA kits. Staff at FWRI provided MML with many of the supplies needed to make the kits. On a weekly basis, MML volunteers assembled tarpon DNA sampling kits to keep a target inventory of at least 500 kits available for distribution. The following are numbers of kits that were assembled and distributed by MML in 2011 and through February 2012:

#### Angler Contributions

During the contract period there were 1,453 tarpon DNA samples submitted to MML by shops and individual anglers. Anglers were enthusiastic about participating in the study and many expressed that they were helping to promote the study in their area. This was certainly evident in the progress as displayed in the TGRS 2011 newsletter (Appendix). As stated by K. Guindon, by October 31, 2011, a total of 4,024 samples were returned during 2011; of those, 3,861 DNA samples were collected from tarpon caught in Florida waters. There were 121 anglers who contributed five or more samples in 2011. Samples to date provided more than 100 recaptures. These samples, contributed by "citizen scientists" are helping us to gain valuable information to learn more about ranges and patterns of tarpon movements, and the linkages or connectivity, if any, between certain spawning grounds and off-season locations (K. Guindon, 2011 TGRS Newsletter).







#### THE TARPON GENETIC RECAPTURE STUDY A Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) & Mote Marine Laboratory (MML) Partnership



- The scientific genus name of tarpon is *Megalops*. The name derives from the Greek adjective *megalo* meaning 'large', and the noun *opsi*, meaning 'face'.
- There are two species in the genus Megalops of the family Megalopidae. The Atlantic tarpon is known as Megalops atlanticus and the Indo-Pacific tarpon is known as Megalops cyprinoides, a much smaller fish.
- Tarpon are also known as silver kings, tarpum, cuffum, and sábalos.
- Tarpon are silvery colored with blue-gray backs and have large plate like scales.
- They have a projecting, upturned lower jaw that contains a bony plate.
- Fossil records show that tarpon have been swimming in our oceans since prehistoric times.
- > Tarpon over 100 lbs are common, and a few lucky anglers catch tarpon weighing more than 200 lbs.
- The largest tarpon tend to be females.
- It takes a tarpon 8 -10 yrs to reach sexual maturity.
- > Wild tarpon have been aged as old as 55 yrs. New technology supports that they may live up to 78 years.
- > The record tarpon catch is 286 lbs, 9 ounces in Guinea-Bissau, Africa.
- The Florida record is a 243 lb fish captured off of Key West.
- Tarpon prefer tropical and subtropical waters and are most common from Virginia to central Brazil and throughout the Caribbean Sea and Gulf of Mexico.
- > Tarpon are known to migrate, but <u>little is known</u> about the frequency and extent of their travels.
- The behavior of tarpon swimming in a circular rotating motion is known as a "daisy chain". This behavior may be a pre-spawning behavior exhibited before moving to offshore spawning areas.
- ➢ In one spawning season a female may produce from 4.5 to more than 20 million eggs.
- Spawning in Florida waters mainly occurs in May, June, and July.
- Tarpon eggs hatch into microscopic larvae called leptocephali that have a transparent ribbonlike body with slender, fanglike teeth.
- > Tarpon larvae only a few days old have been collected as far as 125 miles offshore in the Gulf of Mexico.
- Larvae drift with currents toward shore, reaching estuarine areas within 30 50 days and are about an inch long at this time. Storm events like hurricanes can shorten that transport time.
- > Juvenile tarpon spend their first year in marshes and mangrove swamps, a very important nursery habitat.
- > Young tarpon have rapid growth and can reach 12 -16 inches in length in one year.
- Tarpon is the only fully MARINE species that can breathe air using their swimbladder as an auxiliary breathing organ. This allows them to survive is harsh environments.
- Tarpon can only be fished recreationally in Florida. The majority of recreational anglers practice catch and release since the fish is not considered to be of any food value. However, anglers can possess them for trophy purposes at the cost of \$50.00 per tag, per fish. Without this tag, possession is illegal.

## RECAPTURES, RECAPTURES: Read all about it!

Database documents more than 100 recaptured tarpon



Since 2005, anglers participating in the Tarpon Genetic Recapture Study have been helping researchers gain insight into this fascinating species. When anglers catch a tarpon and collect a DNA sample for the study, they are contributing valuable information to a growing database.

Biologists use the database to identify when a tarpon has been caught and sampled more than once. Biologists refer to these fish as recaptures. The database now includes more than 100 documented recaptures. The following reports share some of the information being gained from recaptured tarpon.

#### Learning about seasonal movements of adult tarpon

To examine the movements of tarpon, researchers classify recaptures according to the season and the size or life history stage of the tarpon. Peak fishing season for large tarpon in most of Florida usually corresponds with spawning season, April through July. The remaining months comprise the off-season.

The map indicates where an adult tarpon was caught and sampled off Apalachicola beaches ("C") during the July 2007 sampling season. It was recaptured two years later in May 2009 off Captiva ("R"). This tarpon's journey of more than 280 miles represents the farthest distance yet between initial capture and resampling events for a fish in this study.



DNA samples also documented the travels of two other Gulf coast tarpon to the Florida Keys. Both were caught in Charlotte Harbor in August 2010. One was recaptured in March 2011 in Islamorada; the other, in April 2011 off Key West.

Several other spawning-season recaptures demonstrate a connection between estuarine systems of the central Gulf coast of Florida. In 2010, a tarpon caught during a June tournament in Boca Grande Pass was recaptured in August inside Tampa Bay. And a tarpon caught inside Charlotte Harbor in May 2010 was recaptured the following May at the mouth of Tampa Bay.

Such recaptures will continue to provide information about ranges and patterns of movement and the linkages or connectivity, if any, between certain spawning grounds and off-season locations.

#### Learning about juvenile and subadult tarpon habitats

Four tarpon in the ever-growing Tarpon Genetic Recapture Study database were caught and recaptured nearby during the same off-season. The recaptures occurred in four different areas of the southern peninsula of Florida: the Tampa Bay area, the Ten Thousand Islands, Turkey Creek south of Merritt Island, and north of Miami Beach. All involved immature fish, indicating there are juvenile or subadult tarpon habitats throughout southern Florida that support tarpon even during the winter months.

Another juvenile tarpon was caught and sampled in the Loxahatchee River system in June 2007, then recaptured 810 days later by the same angler in September 2009, approximately two miles from its original capture location. This recapture event shows that a river system can be an important habitat for a subadult tarpon for multiple years.



Each of these four tarpon was recaptured ("R") less than five miles from its initial capture location ("C").

## How FWC biologists identify individual tarpon using DNA fingerprinting techniques

The most important part of the process is step one: anglers collecting and returning DNA samples from *any tarpon, anywhere, any size* for processing in the genetics laboratory at the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) Fish and Wildlife Research Institute (FWRI). Without angler assistance, there would be no Tarpon Genetic Recapture Study.


Once a tarpon DNA sample arrives at the lab in St. Petersburg, scientists remove the skin cells from the abrasive sponge and place the material in a small tube containing a soapy solution with enzymes. This solution breaks down the cell membranes and releases DNA from the cell nuclei. Adding saltwater and alcohol causes the DNA to clump together and allows scientists to extract it in a dehydrated form that they can reconstitute by adding water.

A process of rapid heating and cooling called a polymerase chain reaction uses primer chemicals to further isolate repeating segments of DNA, called microsatellites. Scientists can replicate (copy) those segments that are unique to tarpon, as if they were running tarpon DNA through a photocopier.

Tarpon samples next go into a DNA analyzer (A) that can read the genetic profile, or genotype, of up to 96 tarpon at a time. The machine prints out images displaying peaks that represent each tarpon's genotype (B).

The final step is to "read" the DNA, using 10 different primer chemicals to distinguish 10 microsatellites. The resulting image reflects the unique DNA of each individual fish. If the peaks for all microsatellites match those of a previously sampled tarpon in the database, the reading indicates a suspected recapture. Only after a second scientist checks and confirms the match does the study record a recaptured tarpon. By following this procedure, scientists can identify a tarpon's unique DNA "fingerprint" with odds of an error at less than 1 in a billion.

## The importance of the Atlantic tarpon recreational fishery to Florida's economy

Tarpon support a lucrative recreational catch-and-release fishery that infuses millions of dollars into Florida's economy. Dr. Tony Fedler, fisheries economist with Human Dimensions Consulting in Gainesville, surveyed resident saltwater fishing license holders to assess the direct and total economic impact of tarpon fishing on the local economies of the Everglades, the Caloosahatchee and Charlotte Harbor area, and the St. Lucie River system. Results from Fedler's economic analyses, summarized here, were presented at the fourth International Bonefish and Tarpon Symposium in Dania Beach in November 2011.

#### **Tarpon Fishery's Regional Economic Benefits**

**The dollars and cents of a tarpon DNA sample:** From start to finish, the cost for researchers to create a DNA sampling kit and then process a returned sample in the St. Petersburg laboratory is only about \$3.35! It is a very inexpensive way to learn more about tarpon.

## A call to tarpon anglers in Florida's Panhandle and northern Gulf

Mid- to late summer brings great tarpon fishing to Florida's Panhandle as large tarpon migrate to the northern Gulf of Mexico in great abundance and linger to feed in the productive Mississippi River plume. Not so abundant are tarpon DNA samples from this part of Florida.

Biologists took the opportunity in June to tell Panhandle tarpon guides about the Tarpon Genetic Recapture Study. Tom Morgan, owner of Apalach Outfitters in the heart of historic downtown Apalachicola, hosted the special event. Captain Christian Yeargens secured a nice prize basket supplied by Mote Marine Laboratory and project sponsors. In February 2012, a

tarpon workshop for the public will be held at the Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve. The workshop will raise awareness of this study and other tarpon research in the region, as well as encourage more angler participation in these projects.

We urge all tarpon anglers—especially those in the northern Gulf—to carry a DNA kit and sample their fish, so scientists can continue to link together movement patterns and habitat usage. We need your samples!

## Scrape means SCRAPE!

Don't waste in haste: don't waste your opportunity to sample your tarpon by rushing through the scraping process. It takes only a few seconds, but you must use enough pressure to get skin cells on the sponge. Silver or white indicates that you have removed enough tissue to extract DNA. Without a good scrape, scientists will not be able to determine whether you have captured a previously sampled fish. Proper technique tremendously increases the odds that scientists will be able to identify your tarpon as a unique individual.



Sampling tip: wipe away the slime with one side of the sponge, then flip the sponge over to scrape and remove skin cells for a good DNA sample.




# Anglers reach new sampling heights


The number of tarpon DNA samples returned each year is growing by leaps and bounds. Since the Tarpon Genetic Recapture Study began in 2005, 12,834 tarpon tissue samples have been submitted for DNA analysis. By October 31, 4,024 samples had been returned during 2011; of those, 3,861 DNA samples were taken from tarpon caught in Florida waters.

The remainder came from six other southern states.



Within Florida, distribution of samples by region was fairly even. Most adult tarpon were sampled along the Gulf coast; most juvenile tarpon, along the Atlantic coast, where sampling increased 178% over 2010 numbers. Keys anglers increased submissions 64% and returned more DNA samples in 2011 than ever before. Thank you, anglers!





## **Congratulations!**

Congratulations to the anglers who won random drawings and special challenges this year. Remember, even if you catch one tarpon all year, that single DNA sample can help advance our understanding of tarpon distribution, movement, habitat preferences, and survival.
