

## Introduction

This atlas is the culmination of an attempt to document the recent marine and estuarine mollusks occurring within North Carolina waters. Nothing before of this extent has been attempted for the North Carolina molluscan fauna, though, Bookhout (1953), Ferguson, etc. (1966) and Wolfe & Wolfe (1970) have compiled partial check-lists. This documentation should aid the many ecological studies being undertaken in the estuarine and marine waters of North Carolina, provide published taxonomic information previously unknown to many biologists and delineate the North Carolina marine and estuarine molluscan fauna. In ecological studies where molluscan species are involved, it is essential to know the correct identity of the species and its previously published environmental and geographic records. The atlas is an aid in identification only in that it provides a list of mollusks known to occur in North Carolina waters.

Among the first recorded accounts of the North Carolina marine and/or estuarine molluscan fauna are papers by Kurtz (1860) and Stimpson (1860). These and such later accounts as Coues (1871), Coues & Yarrow (1878) and Osborn (1887) were concerned primarily with the fauna of the Beaufort area. During the late 1800's a summer seaside station established by Johns Hopkins University frequently was headquartered in Beaufort. In 1899 Drs. H. V. Wilson, a student of Brooks, and J. A. Holmes, professors at the University of North Carolina, established the first fisheries laboratory at Beaufort. It, begun in a rented building by the Bureau of Fisheries, later became the present National Marine Fisheries Service Laboratory located on Pivers Island between Beaufort and Morehead City. The above laboratories served as a base for the molluscan studies of Coker, Grave,

Holmes, Osborn, Wilson and others. Subsequent studies by Aller (1912) and Jacot (1921) not only described the Beaufort fauna as they saw it but also reviewed earlier published works. In 1938 a resurgence of molluscan research took place with the establishment, on Pivers Island, of the Duke University Marine Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. S. Pearse and later Dr. C. G. Bookhout. Drs. Pearse, Bookhout and their students each contributed notable molluscan studies. The establishment in 1947 by the University of North Carolina in Morehead City of the Institute of Marine Sciences (then known as the Institute of Fisheries Research) further increased the output of molluscan research in the Beaufort Inlet general area and estuarine areas of the state.

The mollusk collection of the University of North Carolina Institute of Marine Sciences is primarily a collection of mollusks from North Carolina waters. Its basis for existence is to provide a repository for identified molluscan specimens from the many ecological habitats in North Carolina waters, to aid in the identification of mollusks being studied in ecological and physiological research (particularly by the four major marine laboratories in the Beaufort - Morehead City area) and to act as a data resource for taxonomic studies. Development and curating of the collections has been by the author. At present, the collection consists of over 4700 catalogued entries and/or series. A significant proportion of the collection resulted from funded studies on the North Carolina commercial population of the Calico Scallop, Argopecten gibbus (Linne). Many of the species in the collection have been identified through comparison with specimens in the mollusk collections of the following: Academy of Natural Sciences of Philadelphia, American Museum of Natural History, Harvard University - Museum of Comparative Zoology and the United States National Museum. Identification of

special groups has been greatly aided by Dr. H. E. Coomans - Marginellidae, Dr. D. R. Moore - Caecidae, Dr. R. Robertson - Architectonicidae and Mr. D. Steger - Triphora species and Turridae.

Not all early North Carolina molluscan studies were done in the vicinity of Beaufort Inlet. In the late 1800's, Apgar, Bush and Verrill each published about mollusks in the Cape Hatteras area. Later, Dall published many taxonomic papers which mentioned North Carolina collected material and were based on extensive offshore collections in the United States National Museum. In 1964, the Duke University Marine Laboratory in conjunction with the National Science Foundation began an active offshore oceanographic program. This program has and continues to spawn numerous papers of interest concerning molluscan ecology and taxonomy throughout the North Carolina marine ecological zone area.

The Cape Fear region has been less extensively studied. Kurtz (1860) mentions a few molluscan species collected from this region. The writings of Dall include species from the area. Unfortunately for the atlas, some early writers like Thomas Say and Stimpson made little or no distinction between North and South Carolina. In reality, probably no distinction should be made between North and South Carolina marine molluscan fauna. Cape Fear is the dominant ecological influence in the southern marine waters of North Carolina and it is also probably the dominant influence for marine waters of the northern half of South Carolina.

The area included in this atlas is not an exact entity. For estuarine mollusks and those marine mollusks occurring in near-shore waters, the northern limit for consideration in the atlas was considered the Virginia and North Carolina state line (N. Lat. 36° 36'); southern limit was considered the North and South

Carolina state line (N. Lat. 33° 50'). In offshore waters the encompassed area under consideration could not be as definite. While the northern boundary was not hard to define, the area under influence by Cape Hatteras (considered by most ecologists as within North Carolina waters) enlarges as it extends offshore; thus, in quite deep waters some mollusks recorded from North Carolina waters by various authors, because they were living within the area influenced by Cape Hatteras, were actually found north of N. Lat. 36° 36'.

The southern boundary for the offshore North Carolina molluscan fauna is controversial. Ecologically the Cape Fear zone of influence is traditionally treated as within North Carolina waters since Cape Fear, like Cape Hatteras, occurs within the state. Cape Fear, however, extends downward from North Carolina in a S.S.E. to S.E. direction; thus, much of the Cape Fear zone of influence is off the South Carolina coast. As an example, Dall (1889, p. 75) states that Leucosyrinx verrillii Dall (Turridae) occurs off Cape Fear at depths between 150 to 731 fms. This is within the Cape Fear zone of influence, however, the area is due east, midway between Georgetown and Charleston, South Carolina. In this atlas the southern boundary for offshore molluscan records, where station data was available, was considered to be that area in the immediate vicinity of Cape Fear and running in a S.E. direction from it.

Mollusks are arranged taxonomically generally according to the scheme of Keen (1971). Where this scheme was not applicable, that of Thiele (1929-35) was used. The taxonomy of many groups is in a state of flux. Such families as Cerithiidae, Eulimidae, Olividae, Pyramidellidae, Turridae and Vitrinellidae, which contain many micromollusks, have numerous inadequacies.

Included with each species in the atlas is a listing of all references seen which record the species as occurring in North Carolina waters. Some authors, while not recording that the species occurred in North Carolina waters, included a range of occurrence that inferred the species might or should be found in North Carolina waters; these references were included and noted specifically.




Fig. 1. Molluscan localities referred to in North Carolina Marine and Estuarine Mollusca - Atlas. Note following key for numbered localities.

Scientific name and where possible the accepted common name of each listed mollusk is given in the atlas. With each scientific name is a bibliographic record of all known North Carolina references for that species. Parentheses following a reference enclose given locality data. Because of space requirements, locality data for bibliographic references was reduced to an abbreviation indicating the North Carolina cape that the data was closest to. Localities may be located through use of Fig. 1. Depth ranges follow locality data, when given. Many references were simply reviews of earlier works and in consequence gave no locality or range data. Synonyms are given for listed mollusks when these synonyms were used in place of the accepted scientific name. Known published identification and/or spelling errors are treated as synonyms. A publishing deadline prevented adequate research into synonymies of all listed species, consequently some listed species may be synonyms of other listed species. For the same reason, some references have been missed, as for example - the many works of A. A. Gould and B. W. Tryon, Jr.

An attempt has been made to limit the atlas only to recent species. Unfortunately, much of the recorded literature does not indicate whether or not individual species were live collected. Also, many species recorded from the collection of the Institute of Marine Sciences were collected only as shell. Thus, some of the species listed in this atlas unavoidably may be of fossil origin.

A number of persons have contributed to putting this atlas together. Among staff members of the Institute of Marine Sciences, Drs. A. F. Chestnut, W. E. Fahy and F. J. Schwartz were most helpful. Mrs. Doris Oakley contributed much in technical aid. Further, without the help of Rosemond Baldree, Linda Gillikin, Joyce Lewis, Elaine Spalding and Genell Willard, the project would have been almost impossible. Appreciation is also given to the staff of the Academy of Natural Sciences of Philadelphia, the American Museum of Natural History, The Harvard Museum of Comparative Zoology and the United States National Museum which permitted use of their facilities and answered many bibliographic and taxonomic questions raised by the author. Particular thanks is given to Mr. R. E. Petit for his review and criticisms.
